



# NCCER Core Construction Curriculum Certification



The National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) Core Curriculum is an excellent introduction to the trades. With modules covering essential construction industry topics, learners have the ability to receive training and show their skills both through written and performance based examinations. Upon completion of the training, learners receive a recognized industry credential, wallet card, and certificate of completion through the NCCER Registry.

## Topics include:

- Basic Safety
- Introduction to Construction Math
- Introduction to Hand Tools
- Introduction to Power Tools
- Introduction to Construction Drawings
- Introduction to Basic Rigging (optional)
- Basic Communication Skills
- Basic Employability Skills
- Introduction to Material Handling



## How the Program Works:

- All instructors need to attend a 1-day Instructor Certification Training Program (ICTP)
- Schools purchase textbooks for students and instructors.
- Each topic has a written test that the students need to pass with at least at 70%.
- All topics except “Introduction to Construction Math” and “Basic Employability Skills” have a performance test where students demonstrate ability to do the tasks.
- Instructors teach the curriculum within their classes. They maintain records and complete the necessary forms. At the end of the training, the materials are submitted to ABC of Wisconsin. ABC of Wisconsin submits the materials to NCCER.
- Students who fully pass all modules receive a certificate of completion and a wallet card.
