



Electrical Level Advancement Exam

What: The ABC-WI Electrical Level Advancement Exam provides an opportunity for new apprentices to test out of the first year of paid related instruction. The exam includes separate written and practical portions and measures an individual's competency on the *entire Level 1 curriculum*, including: DC and AC theory, basic wiring principles and print reading, introductory National Electrical Code topics, trade-related math skills, and construction trades safety. A calculator and NEC book may be used throughout the exam.

When: The Level Advancement Exam is held each year during the first week of August. The written exam begins in the morning. Apprentices who pass the written portion of the exam may move on to the practical portion of the exam in the afternoon. Apprentices must pass both the written and practical portions to receive credit.

Where: The exam is proctored by an electrical instructor in an apprenticeship classroom and lab at the Fox Valley Technical College campus in Appleton.

Who can take the exam: Any contracted ABC-WI electrical apprentice who has not yet begun paid related instruction is eligible to take the exam. The apprentice must submit the exam fee and registration form signed by the apprentice and employer prior to taking the exam. *Note: ABC-WI strongly encourages anyone attempting the exam to have prior work and academic experience covering all Level 1 topics.*
